ORDER APPROVING DEED OF FULL BLOOD INDIAN HEIR.

Now on this 25th day of August, 1923, comes on to be heard the petition of Cheparney Fisher, for approval of a deed made and executed by him to Frances E. Nelson on the 6th day of August, 1923, wherein and whereby he, the said Cheparney Fisher, granted, bargained, sold conveyed and deeded unto the said Frances E. Nelson, his undivided one-sixth interest in and to the following described real estate, situated in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma;

The E/2 of NW4 of NE4, and W2, of NE4 of the NE4
of sec. 18, T. 19 N, R. 11, E, of the Indian Base and
Meridian containing 40 acres, more or less, according to
the government survey thereof;

and said Cheparney Fisher, appearing in person, and said grantee appearing by her attorney, and Peter Deichman, U.S. Probate Attorney within and for the county of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, appearing in his official capacity and the Court having heard the evidence, finds;

That the said Cheparney Fisher, is a full blood Creek Indian duly enrolled as such on the tribal rolls on the Creek Nation, opposite Roll No. 8812; that the said decedent, Aggie Fisher was a full blood Creek Indian duly enrolled as such on the tribal rolls of the Creek Nation, opposite Roll No. 8811; that the said Aggie Fisher died intestate on the 9th day of July, 1919, that the said deceased, Amos Fisher was a full blood Creek Indian duly enrolled as such on the tribal rolls of the Creek Nation, opposite Roll No. 8810; that both of said decedents were residents of the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, at the time of their deaths; that the said Amos Fisher died intestate on or about the 24th day of June, 1923; that Cheparney Fisher and Callie Island, nee Fisher, are the son and daughter, respectively of the said Aggie Fisher and Amos Fisher, deceased, both of whom are enrolled as full blood Creek Indians.

That by reason of the death of the said Aggie Fisher, deceased, the said Amos Fisher, deceased, Cheparney Fisher and Callie Island, nee Fisher, each inherited an undivided one-third interest in and to the said lands above described.
