Nelson, his undivided onesixth interest in and to the following described real estate, situated in Tuba County, State of Oklahoma;

> The E/2 of NW4 of NE4, and W2, of NE4 of the NE4 of sec. 18, t. 19 N, R11, E, of the Indian Base and Meridian consining 40 acres, mor or less, according to the government survey thereof;

and said Chepsrney Fisher, appearing in person, and said granteespearing by her attorney, and Peter Deichman, U.S.Probate Attoenry within and for the county of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, appearing in his official capacity and the Court having heard the evidence, finds;
