ORDER FOR REMOVAL OF RESTRICTIONS

Whereas, Jesse D. Sunday, a citizen of the Cherokee Nation was allotted certain land, which land is restricted against alienation.

Now therefore, I, under the authority vested in me by the Act of Congress approved May 27, 1906 (35 Stat. L. 312) and the regulations of the Department prescribed thereunder, hereby remove, without conditions, concerning terms of sale and disposal of proceeds, the restrictions on alienation of all the restricted allotted lands of said Indian allottee, and the restrictions on the alienation of all lands purchased for the benefit of said Indian allottee, with funds held under the control of the Secretary of the Interior, which lands were by the terms of the deed of conveyance, impressed with restrictions on alienation, such removal of restrictions to be effective thirty days from date hereof.
