approved July 1, 1902 (32 Stat, 716, ratified by the Cherokee Nation August 7, 1902,it was provided that there should be allotted by the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes to seach citizen of the Cherokee Nation, land equal in value to one hundred and ten acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation; and,

Whereas, it was provided by said act, of Congress that each member of said tri be shall, at the time of the selection of his allotment, designate, or have selected and designated for him, from his allotment land equal in value to forty acres of the average allotable lands of the Cherokee Nation, as nearly as may be, as a homestead, for which separate certificate shall issue; and

Whereas, the said Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes has certified that the land hereinafter described has been selected by or on behalf of Robert R. Fields, a citizen of said tribe, as a homestead;

New, therefore, I, the undersigned, the Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid act of the Congress of the United States, have granted and conveyed, and by these presents do grat and convey unto the said Robert R. Fields, all right, title, and interest of the Cherokee Nation, and of all other citizens of said nation, in and to athe following described land, viz: The east half of the northeast quarter of the south west quarter of section ten (10) township twenty two (22) north and range fourteen (14) east, of the Indian Base and meridian, in Indian Territory, containing twenty (20) acres, more or less, as the case may be, according to the United States curvey thereof, subject, however, to the conditions provided by said act of Congress pertaining to allotted homesteads.

In witness whereof, I, the Princhpel Chieffof the Cherokee Nation, have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of said nation to be affixed on this 29th day of June, A.D. 1905.

To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting:

Whereas, by the actof Chagress, approved July 1, 1902 (32 Stat, 716) ratified by
