KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That Addie Hensley, of the City of Tulsa, Tulsa County and the State of Oklahoma, party of the first part, has mortgaged and hereby mortgages to J. O. Campbell of the City of Tulsa, Tulsa County State of Oklahoma, the party of the second part, the following described real estate and premises situate in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

The East Fifty (50) feet of the North one Hundred and Fifty (150) feet of Lot two (2) in Block Three (3) in Vern Subdivision to the city of Tulsa, Oklahoma, according to the amended recorded official plat thereof,

and the following described Chattels, to-wit:

Five rooms of furniture and house hold appliances now belonging to the party of the first part,

with all improvements thereon and appurtenances thereto belonging, and warrant the title to the same.

This mortgage is given to secure the party of the second part against any loss by reason of following described notes, to-wit:

Once principal note in the sum of \$3500.00, made on the 21st. day of February, 1920 by C. H. Overton and Annie Overton, in favor of the Atlas Life Insurance Co. Tulsa, Oklahoma, due on the 21st. day of February 1923, and four interest coupon notes of the same date payable in the amount of \$140.00 each on the 21st. day of August and February of each year, and secured by a mortgage.

The conditions of said notes being that said party of the first part had heretofore purchased said notes, and lost the same, that in order to collect the same it became necessary that a bond be made by the party of the first part to the maker of said notes against any loss, by the notes afterwards being found. That the party of the second part has purchased said notes and paid to the first party the sum of Three Thousand dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the party of the first part, and the party of the second part has made a Bond to the maker of said notes, securing said makers of the notes from any loss by reason of said notes ever being found, and collection made.

And the conditions of the obligation are such, that in the event that said notes should be found and the party of the second part should become liable, and have to pay the said notes hereinbefore described, then in that event this mortgage shall be in
