 WITNESSETH, That said part 188 of the first part, in consideration of the sum of
 Six Hundred and No/100 Dollars
 the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby present, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto said part 7 of the second part his
 and assigns, all the following described real estate situated in Tulsa County and State of
 Oklahoma to-wit:

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular, the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging, or in anywise apper-
 taining forever.

This conveyance is intended as a mortgage to secure the payment of six promissory notes of even date here-
 with. One for \$100.00 due September 1st, 1924. One for \$100.00 due December 1st, 1924; one
 for \$100.00 due March 1st, 1925; one for \$100.00 due June 1st, 1925; one for \$100.00 due
 September 1st, 1925 and one for \$100.00 due December 1st, 1925.

 or order, payable at Tulsa, Oklahoma quarterly
 with eight per cent interest per annum, payable semi-annually and signed by
 W. I. Schultz and Jean Morris Schultz, husband and wife

Said first part 188 hereby covenant that they are the owner in fee
 simple of said premises and that they are free and clear of all incumbrances except a mortgage to The Mortgage Bond Company of
 New York for \$2200.00, which is a first mortgage on said property.

That they have
 They will warrant and defend the same against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever. Said first part 188 agree to insure the buildings on said
 premises in the sum of \$100.00 for the benefit of the mortgagee and maintain such insurance during the existence of this mortgage. Said first part 188
 agree to pay all taxes and assessments lawfully assessed on said premises before delinquent.

Said first part 188 further expressly agree that in case of foreclosure of this mortgage and as often as any proceeding shall be taken to foreclose same
 as herein provided, the mortgagor will pay to the said mortgagee Sixty and No/100 Dollars
 as attorney's or solicitor's fees therefor, in addition to all other statutory fees; said fee to be due and payable upon the filing of the petition for foreclosure and the same
 shall be a further charge and lien upon said premises described in this mortgage and the amount thereon shall be recovered in said foreclosure suit and included in any
 judgement or decree rendered in action as aforesaid, and collected, and the lien thereof enforced in the manner as the principal debt hereby secured.

Now if said first part 188 shall pay or cause to be paid to said second part 7, his heirs or assigns said
 sum of money in the above described note mentioned, together with the interest thereon according to the terms and tenor of said note, and shall make and maintain such insurance and pay such taxes and assessments then these presents shall be wholly discharged and void otherwise shall remain in full
 force and effect. If said insurance is not effected and maintained, or if any and all taxes and assessments which are or may be levied and assessed lawfully against
 said premises, or any part thereof, are not paid before delinquent then the mortgagee may effect such insurance or pay such taxes and assessments and shall
 be allowed interest thereon at the rate of ten per cent per annum, until paid, and this mortgage shall stand as security for all such payments; and if said
 sum or sums of money or any part thereof is not paid when due, or if such insurance is not effected and maintained or any taxes or assessments are not paid before
 delinquent, the holder of said note and this mortgage may elect to declare the whole sum or sums and interest thereon due and payable at once and proceed to
 collect said debt including attorney's fees, and to foreclose this mortgage, and shall become entitled to possession of said premises.

Said first part 188 waive notice of election to declare the whole debt as above and also the benefit of stay, valuation or appraisal laws.
