ORDER APPROVING OIL AND GAS LEASE BY FULL BLOOD INDIAN HEIRS.

Now on this 2nd day of Nov. 1923, this matter coming on for hearing in open court upon the petition of Stanwaitie Tiger, Lizzie Tiger, nee Thomas, and Minnie Bond, nee Tiger, for the approval by this court of an oil and gas lease made by them to M. W. Thompson on August 11, 1923, of record in the office of the County Clerk of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, in book 463, at page 14, covering the following described lands in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, allotted to the heirs of Sah-co-po-chuny Tiger, full-blood Creek Indian, Roll No. 9214, deceased, to-wit:

South forty (40) acres of lot three (3) and the south forty (40) acres of lot four (4) and the south half (S $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the northwest quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of section five (5) township sixteen (16) north, range thirteen (13) east;

and the court being advised in the premises, and having heard the evidence and testimony submitted, finds that said Sah-co-po-chuny Tiger was a duly enrolled full-blood Indian citizen of the Creek Nation, enrolled opposite No. 9214, on the roll of citizens of said Nation prepared by the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes; that the above described lands were allotted to her heirs, as her distributive share of the lands of said Nation, that she died intestate on or about the 10th day of April, 1899, while a resident in good faith of Okmulgee County, Oklahoma, that she left at her death, as her sole and only heirs, the said Stanwaitie Tiger, her husband, full-blood Creek Indian, Roll No. 1935, the said Lizzie Tiger,
