In witness whereof, I, the Principal Chief. of the Cherokee Nations, have hereunto set my hand and caused the Creat Seal of said Nation to be affixed this 26th day of March, A.D. 1989.

COMPARED

To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting:

Whereas, by the Act of Congress approved May 1, 1902 (32 Stat. 716) ratified by the Corokee Nation August 7, 1902, it was provided that there should be allotted by the Commissioner to the Five Civilized Tribes, to each citizen of the Cherokee Nation, land equal in value to one humdred and ten acres of the average allotable lands of the Cherokee Nation, and

Whereas, it was provided by said Act of Congress that eachmember of said tribe shall, at the time of the selection of his allotment, designate, or have selected and designated for him, from his allotment, land equal in value to fourty acres of the average allotable lands of the Cherokee Nation, as nearly as may be, as a homestead, for which severate certificate shall issue; and,

Whereas, the said Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes, or its lawful successor, has certified that the land hereinafter described has been selected by or on behalf of Walter F. Smith, a citizen of said tribe, as a homestead.

Now, therefore, I, the undersigned, the Principal Chiefof the Cherokee Nation, by virtue of the powerand authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act of Congress of the United States, have granted and conveyed, and by these presents do grant and convey unto the said Walter F. Smith, all right, title and interest of the Cherokee Nation, and all right, title and of all other citizens of said
