That from and after this ordinance takes effect the real estate described in Section 1, hereof, shall be a part of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, and all persons residing therein and all property situated thereon, shall be and are hereby declared to be subject to in all respects and particulars, the jurisdiction, control and laws and ordinances of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma.

SECTION 3. That an emergency exists for the preservation of the public health and safety, by reason whereof, this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.
