## WARRANTY DEED, WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER

## WESTERN JUDICIAL DISTRICT INDIAN TERRITORY.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That I, Lizzie Cloud mother and sole heir of Wiley Cloud deceased his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred and twenty Dollars, to me in hand paid by Robert Oglesby the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Robert Oglesby and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The South east quarter of the North west quarter of Section Twelve (12) Township nineteen (19) north and range eleven (11) East the same being the Homestead of the said Wiley Cloud and containing Forty acres more or less.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Robert Oglesby and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Robert Oglesby that she will forever warrant and defend the title of the said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, - - wife of the said - - - for and in consideration of the said sum of money do hereby release and relinquish unto the said - - - all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
