

the center of said strip of ground, commonly known as HASKELL STREET, for the purposes above specified.

And provided, further, that the above vacation is made subject to the conditions and provisions of Paragraph 11 of Section 6, Article II, of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma.

SECTION 2. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance insofar as such conflict exists, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. That an emergency exists for the preservation of the public welfare and safety by reason whereof this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.

PASSED, and the emergency clause ruled upon separately and approved this 13th day of November, 1923.

ORDINANCE NO. 2533.

COMPARED

An ordinance vacating the alley in Block 20, College Addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, according to the official plat thereof, with certain reservations, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, a petition signed by all of the property owners owning property in Block 20 of College Addition to the city of Tulsa, Oklahoma, has been presented to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Tulsa, asking that the alley therein described, to wit: the alley running north and south from Seventh to Eighth be vacated and abandoned as a public alley.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF TULSA, OKLA.:

SECTION 1. That the alley running north and south in Block 20 College Addition, to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, from Seventy to Eighth Street, according to the official plat thereof, be and the same is hereby vacated and abandoned, as a public alley in said City.

SECTION 2. Provided, however, that the City of Tulsa hereby reserves and shall retain forever, the right to construct, reconstruct, repair, maintain and operate sanitary sewers and other appurtenances thereto appertaining, now located in said alley or which of necessity should be constructed or maintained in said alley, with the right of ingress and egress over and through said premises for the purposes above indicated, and for said purposes four (4) feet on each side of the center line of said alley is hereby maintained by the city of Tulsa.
