ORDER APPROVING FULL BLOOD DEED

Now on this the 6th day of December, 1923, this matter coming on for hearing in open court upon the petition of Thomas Jefferson, for the approval of this court of a certain quit claim deed executed by the said Thomas Jefferson, a full-blood Creek Indian enrolled opposite Roll No. 737, of the records of the Dawes Commission, quit-claiming to Thomas Chestnut all the right, title and interest of the petition in and to the following described land situated in Tulsa County, Oklahoma:

TRACT No. 1

The southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of section 18, township 19 north, Range 13 east, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, and more particularly described as follows: Beginning at a point at the southwest corner of section 18, township 19 north, range 13 east, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, thence northerly along center line of section line road a distance of 660 feet to a point; thence easterly a distance of 660 feet to a point; thence southerly a distance of 660 feet to a point on the center line of section line road; thence westerly a distance of 660 feet to place of beginning, containing 10 acres, more or less, and known as Edgewood Drive Addition to the City of Tulsa, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, excepting therefrom lots 4 and 5 of block 1, and lots 4, 5, and 6, of block 2, of said addition.

TRACT NO. 2

The northeast quarter of the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of section 18, township 19 north, range 13 east, Tulsa County, Oklahoma.

The court finds from the evidence that Lena Jefferson was a full-blood Creek Indian enrolled opposite No. 735; that she died on or about January 9, 1907, intestate, and a citizen resident in good faith of what is now Tulsa County, Oklahoma; that she left no husband surviving her; that she left no descendent or descendants of any dead child or children surviving her; that she was survived by her three sons, who were her sole and only children and who were her sole and only heirs at law. The court finds that said three sons were; Moses Jefferson, a full-blood Creek Indian enrolled opposite Roll No. 7361, Walter Jefferson, a full-blood Creek Indian enrolled opposite Roll No. 738; and the petitioner, Thomas Jefferson, a full-blood Creek Indian enrolled opposite Roll No. 737. The court further finds from the evidence that on the death of the said Lena Jefferson the said Thomas Jefferson, as one of her children and as one of her sole heirs, inherited an interest in the said Lena Jefferson's above described allotment. The court further finds that the consideration of \$736.82 of and for said quit claim deed was and has been duly paid to the said Thomas Jefferson, and the same is and was an adequate consideration of and for the land described in said quit claim deed, and that said quit claim deed should be approved and affirmed by this court.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, CONSIDERED AND ADJUDGED that said quit claim deed executed on the 6th day of ^{December} November, 1923, by the said Thomas Jefferson (an unmarried man), full-blood Creek Indian whose Roll is No. 737, quit-claiming all his right, title and interest in and to the aforesaid land, to-wit:
