#### BILL OF SALE.

This indenture, made this 31st day of December, 1923, between R. D. Sanford, as sheriff of the County of Tulsa, in the State of Oklahoma, party of the first part, and L.D. Chamberlain of the County of Tulsa, party of the second part:

Witnesseth, that whereas, by virtue of a execution and order of sale issued out of and under the seal of the District Court of Tulsa County, Oklahoma dated the 20th day of November, 1923, upon a judgement for the sum of \$20,935.70, together with costs and attorneys' fees, filed in said court on November 13, 1923, on case No. 22522, and duly docketed in said court, said judgement being in favor of John Price, A. J. Spears, and Chamberlin and Link, a co-partnership composed of L. D. Chamberlin and C. A. Link, and against the Associated Producing and Refining Company, of Oklahoma, a trust estate said writ being issued to the Sheriff of said county, directed and delivered, commanding him that of the oil and gas mining lease of said judgement debtor be levied upon, appraised, advertised and sold to satisfy said judgement and costs.

And whereas, the said Sheriff thereupon on the 21st day of November, 1923, did call an inquest of three disinterested householders resident within said county and state, and administered to them an oath impartially to appraise the property so levied, upon actual view thereof, and the said appraisers having duly appraised said oil and gas lease and all equipment thereon, made return to the sheriff herein, of their appraisalment.

And whereas, said Sheriff thereupon advertised said property for sale by giving due and legal notice of the time and place of sale and the property to be sold by advertising the same in the Legal News, a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in said county and state, as required by law, and by posting as required by law.

And whereas, on the 22nd day of December, 1923, pursuant to said notice of sale, the Sheriff did offer said property for sale at public auction at the front door of the court house in the City of Tulsa, said County and State, at the time stated in said notice of sale, at which sale the said property was sold and struck off to the said L. D. Chamberlin, party of the second part, for \$1600.00, he being the highest bidder, and that being the highest sum bid, and same being more than two-thirds of the appraised value thereof.

And whereas, the said sheriff having made return of said execution into court on the 22nd day of December, 1923, with his proceedings thereunder duly certified, and endorsed thereon, and the said court having carefully examined said proceedings, and being satisfied that the said sale had in all respects been made in conformity with the provisions of law, did on the 21st day of December, 1923, directed that the sheriff make and execute to said purchaser, L. D. Chamberlin, party of the second part, a good and sufficient bill of sale to said premises so sold.
