I hereby certify that the land above described was allotted to Sarah Ross, as a Full-Indian, by virtue of her enrollment opposite number 18171, of the final approved rolls of citizens by blood of the Cherokee Nation, and that said land was sold and the above mortgage executed in accordance with the regulations prescribed under the Act of Congress of May 27, 1908, which authorized the Secretary of the Interior to remove restrictions from allotted lands of the Five Civilized Tribes, "wholly or in part, under such rules and regulations concerning terms of sale and disposal of the proceeds for the benefit of the respective Indians as he may prescribe."

TAX DEED.

Whereas, I, Lelia I. Fewel, did on the 2nd day of January, A.D. 1924, produce to the undersigned W. W. Stuckey, Treasurer of the County of Tulsa, in the State of Oklahoma, a certificate of purchase in writing bearing date of the 7th day of November, 1921, signed by Wayne L. Dickey, who at the last mentioned date was treasurer of said county, from which it appears that Lelia I. Fewel, did on the 7th day of November, A.D. 1921, purchase at public auction at the County Treasurer's office in said county, the tract, parcel or lot or land lastly in this indenture described, and which lot was sold to Lelia I. Fewel, for the sum of ninety three and 40/100 dollars (\$93.40) being the amount due on the following tract or lot of land, returned delinquent for non-payment of taxes costs and charged for the year of 1920, to-wit:

Lots twenty one (21) and twenty two (22) block nine (9)

Overlook Park addition to Tulsa,

All in Tulsa County, and State of Oklahoma.

And it appearing that the said Lelia I. Fewel, is the legal owner of said certificate of purchase, and the time fixed by law, for redeeming the land therein described having now
