said Railroad Rightof Way: thence northerly along said westerly/line to the said north line of section 13 (said line being known as the center line of Twentyfirst Street) thence east along said north line to the point of beginning and declaring an emergency.

Whereas, it has been made to appear to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners nof the City of Tulsa Oklahoma, that the hereinafger described tract of land, situated in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, lies contiguously to and adjoins the present corporate limits of the City of Tulsa Oklahoma, on three or more sides.

Whereas, it further appears to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of said city that the said tract of land hereinafter described abuts said City on three or more sides and should be annexed to the City of Tulsa and entered within its corporate limits and thatsaid tract of land does not exceed forty acres.

Now, therefore, be it ordsined by the Mayor and Bærd of Commissioners of the City of Tulsa. Oklahoma:

Section 1. That a track of land abutting on three sides with the corporate limits of the cityof Tusa, Oklahoma, situated in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the north line and north and south ceter line of section 15, township 19 north, range 12 east, thence south along said center line a distance of four hundred and forty six and four-tenths (446.4) feet to its intersection with the easterly line of the Midland Valley Railroad right of way; thence west, along a line parallel to and four hundred and forty six and four -thens (446.4) feet south of the saidnorth line of section 13, to the westerly line of said railroad right of way; thence northerly abong said westerly line to the saidnorth line of section 13 (said line being known as the center line of twenty first stract); thence east along said north line to the point of beginning; be and the same is hereby added to and annexed to the said City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, and the corporate limits of said Citybe and the same are hereby extended to include said truct of land for all purposes.

Section 2. That the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma hereby retains and reserves a perpetual easement and right to enter upon and use any portion of the above described tract of land and to build, construct, lay, maintain, alter of repair any sewer lines, waterlines, gas lines, telephonefines, telegraph lines, electric line or any other public utilities.

Section 3. That from and after this ordinance takes effect the real estate described in section 1, hereof, shall be a part of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, and all persons residing therein and all property situated thereon, shall be and are hereby declared to be subject in all respects and particulars to the jurisdiction control and laws and ordinances of said: Cityrof Thas, Oklahoma!

Section 4. That an emergency exists for the preservation of the public peace, health and where-safety, by reason/of this ordinance shall take effect from andafter its passage, approval and publication.

Passed and the emergency clause ruled upon separately and approved this 24th day of December, 1923.
