ORDINANCE No. 1813.

An Ordinance accepting and adding to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma certain tracts of land, to-wit All of block 1, the south half of blocks 2, 3, 4 and 5; (the south half of the west half of block 7, and all of blocks 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 21, 22, 23 and 24) all in Orcutt addition to the City of Tulsa, and also Block 1, and the north half of blocks 3 and 4, in Lisleview addition to Tulsa, Oklahoma, All in section 7, township 19 north, range 13 east; and also all that portion of Riverford Addition, not now within the city limits, lying west of Elwood Avenue, east of the Arkansas River, North of Beane Vista Place and South of the Nole Childers allotment in section 11, township 19 north, range 12 east, according to the recorded plats of said additions; And declaring an emergency.

Whereas, certain petitions dated November 21st, 1917, have been filed with the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of said City of Tulsa, which petitions are signed by a majority of the legal voters residing on the tracts of land herein described, and which petitions
