Cole having demanded a deed for the lot, tract, or parcel of land mentioned in said certificate, and it further appearing that said lot, ^{tract} or parcel of land ^{were legally liable for taxation and} had been duly assessed and properly charged on the tax book or duplicate for the year of 1919 and that said lands had been legally advertised for sale for said taxes on the first ^{day} of November, A.D. 1919, and the same could not thereby ^{be} sold to any bidder of bidders at said sale (or any adjourned sale) and that the same were bid off as aforesaid, on the 1st day of November A.D. 1919, in the name of and for said Tulsa County.

Now, therefore, this indenture, made this ²¹ 21st day of January, A.D. 1924, between the State of Oklahoma, by W. W. Stuckey the Treasurer of said County, of the first part and, the said H. N. Cole of the second part:

Witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the premises and the sum of one dollar in hand paid, hath granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents doth grant bargain, sell and convey to the said party of the second part, H. N. Cole, his heirs and assigns, forever, the lot, tract or parcel of land mentioned in said certificate and described as follows, to-wit:

Northwest quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) section
twenty five (25) township eighteen (18) range twelve (12)
all in Tulsa County, and State of Oklahoma,

To have and to hold said mentioned tract, lot or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereunto belonging, to the said party of the second part, H. N. Cole, his heirs and assigns, forever, in as full and ample manner as the said Treasurer of said County is empowered by law to sell the same.
