AGREEMENT.

This indenture, made and entered into this 6th day of December, 1921, by and between Verland Oil & Gas Company, a corporation, party of the first part, and The Exchange National Bank, of Tulsa Oklahoma, a corporation, party of the second part.

Witnesseth: That whereas, the party of the first part is the owner of a certain valid, existing and indefeasible oil and gas mining leases, free and clear of all liens and encumbrances, as follows, to-wit:

(a) Oil and gas mining lease dated May 24th, 1916, executed by Watty Grayson and Maud Grayson to W. P. Tucker, and P. B. Sterling, covering the northeast quarter of the southeast quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of section ten (10) township nineteen north (19N) range fifteen (15 east) Tulsa County, Oklahoma, and appearing duly of record in the office of the Superintendent to the Five Civilized Tribes, the interest involves being an undivided one-half interest.
