ORDINANCE NO. 1691, 5-22

An ordinance vacating the alley lying immediately east of Blocks 206 and 209, Woodlawn Addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, all the owners of the real estate adjacent to the alley herein described, except one, have petitioned this Board to vacate the alley hereinafter mentioned; and

WHEREAS, It appears to the Board that the alley herein described is not necessary for the use of the public as a public alley.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF TULSA OKLAHOMA:

Section 1. That the alley lying immediately east of Blocks 206 and 209, Woodlawn Addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, extending in a northwesterly and southeasterly direction from Roosevelt Street to the south lot of Block 199 of the Original Townsite, be and the same is hereby vacated and abandoned as a public alley of said city.

Provided, however, that the City of Tulsa hereby reserves and shall retain forever the right to construct, reconstruct, repair, maintain and operate sanitary sewers and other appurtenances thereto appertaining now located in said alley, or which of necessity should be constructed or maintained in said alley, with the right of ingress and egress over said premises for the purposes above indicated, and for said purposes the center line of said alley is hereby maintained by the City of Tulsa upon which line the City of Tulsa may allow public service corporations, companies, individuals or itself to construct, maintain and operate facilities for public utilities, including poles, wires, pipes, conduits and other necessary accessories; and

Provided further, that the center line of said alley shall be constructed to mean sufficient space near the center of said alley for the purposes above specified; and provided further that the above vacation is made subject to the conditions and provisions of Paragraph 11 of Section 6 of Article 2 of the Charter of the City of Tulsa.

Section 2. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance in so far as such conflict exists, are hereby repealed.

Section 3. That an emergency exists for the preservation of the public health and safety, by reason whereof this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.

PASSED and the emergency clause ruled upon separately and approved this 18th day of May, 1917.
