Whereas, John Blossom a citizen of the Cherokee Nation, was allotted the following described land, to-wit:

East half (E2) of Southwest Quarter (SW4); East half (E2) of Northwest quarter (NW4) of Southwest quarter (SW4) of Section Thirteen (13) Township Twenty-two (22) North, Range Thirteen (13) East of the Indian Base and Meridian - containing 100. acres, more or less, located in Tulsa County, Oklahoma,
