ORDINANCE NO. 2524.

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING AND ADDING TO THE CITY OF TULSA, OKLAHOMA, A CERTAIN TRACT OF LAND KNOWN AS DOUGLAS PLACE ADDITION, TO THE CITY OF TULSA, OKLAHOMA, ACCORDING TO THE RECORDED PLAT THEREOF, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, a petition in writing has been presented to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, signed by over sixty per cent of the property owners of the tract of land herein described and designated as DOUGLAS PLACE ADDITION to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, said tract of land being in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, and lying contiguous to and adjoining the present corporate limits of the City of Tulsa, which petition prays that said Board annex to said City of Tulsa, said tract of land, and,

WHEREAS, it has been made to appear upon examination, by said board that the tract of land herein described is platted into lots and blocks and is used for residential purposes, and it further appearing to said Board that the prayer of said petitioners should be granted and the land embraced in said petition, should be annexed to said City and that all things necessary to be done for the proper annexation of said tract of land to said City have
