pending, wherein United Savings & Loan Association was plaintiff, and M.L.Gordon and May Gordon were defendants, the said plaintiff United Savings & Loan Association by the consider ation of the Court, recovered a judgment against the said defendants M.L. Gordon and May Gordon for foreclosure, of a mortgage upon the following described lands and tenements of said defendants, to-wit;

Hale rthe party of the second part, for \$1462.00 the said E.M. Hale being the highest bidder, and, that being the highest sum bidden, and the whole price paid for same;

AND WHEREAS, The said sheriff having made return of said execution into said Court, on the 1st day of March, 1924, with his proceedings thereunder duly certified, and endorsed thereon, and the said court having carefully examined said proceedings, and being satisfied that the said sale had in all respects been made in conformity with the provisions of law, did, on the 1st day of March, direct that the sheriff make and execute to said purchaser E.M. Hale, party of the second part, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, and sold conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, convey, and confirm unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, all the estate, right, title and interest which the said judgment debtor, the said M.L.Gordon and May Gordon had on the 28th day of July, 1923, (here name time when judgment lien became effective) or at
