

trust created in this Declaration of Trust; for the ordinary duties arising under such trusteeship, shall be as follows,

an annual compensation, payable semi-annually, equal to one-half of one percent of the reasonable value of the trust estate.

A sum equal to one percent of the reasonable value of all the trust estate distributed according to the terms hereof, at the final closing and settlement of the trust or at the settlement of each respective portion thereof at the times fixed in this Declaration for final settlement.

For the purposes of ascertaining such compensation, the reasonable value of the trust estate inhereby agreed to be the par value of all mortgages, notes, bonds and securities held in this trust.

For any extraordinary services rendered in the execution of the trust, a reasonable compensation shall be allowed the Trustee therefor.

EIGHT. This trust shall be irrevocable.
