ORDER APPROVING DEED OF FULL BLOOD INDIAN HEIR.

Now on this the 15th day of March, 1924, this matter came on to be heard upon the Petition of Callie Island for approval of a deed made and executed by her the 5th day of September, 1923, to T. J. Whitfield, wherein and whereby she, the said Callie Island has granted, bargained sold, conveyed and deeded unto the said T. J. Whitfield her entire undivided one-half interest in and to the following described real estate situated in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, to-wit:

The East half of the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$), and the West half of the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (W $\frac{1}{2}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Eighteen (18), Township Nineteen North (19), Range Eleven (11) East, of the Indian Base Meridian containing forty (40) acres more or less, according to the government survey thereof; and,

Said petitioner, Callie Island, appearing in person, and said grantee appearing in person and by his attorneys Woodard & Westhafer, and also Peter Deichman, United States Probate Attorney having appeared in his official capacity as United States Probate Attorney within and for Tulsa County, Oklahoma: and,

The Court having heard the evidence finds that the said Callie Island is a full blood citizen of the Creek Nation, enrolled opposite Roll No. 3158; that Aggie Fisher, said decedent and the allottee of the above described land, was a full blood Creek Indian duly enrolled as such on the tribal rolls of the Creek Nation, enrolled opposite Roll No. 8811. That the said Aggie Fisher died intestate on the 9th day of July 1919; that the said Amos Fisher was a full blood Creek Indian duly enrolled as such on the tribal rolls of the Creek Nation, opposite Roll No. 8810; that both of said decedents were residents of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, at the time of their deaths; that the said Amos Fisher died intestate on or about the 24th day of June, 1923.
