P E T I T I O N

Comes now Dicy Stake and respectfully shows to the court:

1. That Lewis Bruner, deceased, was a citizen of the full blood of the creek Nation, duly enrolled on the final approved rolls, opposite roll No. 5816, and that by reason of such enrollment he had allotted to him as a part of his distributive share of the lands of the creek Nation, among other lands, the following described real estate and premises situate in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

Lot One (1) being the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter in Section 7, Township 19 North, Range 12 East, comprising 41.92 acres, more or less, according to the United States Survey thereof.

2. That said Lewis Bruner died intestate on or about the 25th day of May, 1899 in that part of the Creek Nation, which is now embraced within the limits of Creek County, State of Oklahoma; that at the time of his death said Lewis Bruner was a child of the age of three or four years, and he died unmarried and without issue, that at the time of the death of said Lewis Bruner, deceased, said Lewis Bruner was a resident of that part of the Creek Nation which is now embraced in Creek County, Oklahoma, and that the County Court of Creek County, Oklahoma, has jurisdiction of the estate of said deceased allottee.

3. That the mother of said Lewis Bruner, deceased was one, Bettie Vore, sometimes known as Bettie Bruner, who was a Creek citizen but died prior to April 1st, 1899; that the mother of said Bettie Bruner, deceased was one, Nancy Vore, who was a citizen of the Creek Nation but died prior to allotment; that one, Sallie Tiger was a sister of said Nancy Vore, and was a citizen of the Creek Nation and died prior to allotment; that one Sampson Tiger was a citizen of the Creek Nation and died prior to allotment; that one Alberd Tiger was a citizen of the Creek Nation, enrolled opposite roll number 5587 on the final approved rolls of the Creek Nation, and said Alberd Tiger was a son of said Sampson Tiger, deceased and Sallie Tiger, deceased; that said Alberd Tiger departed this life on or about the 18 day of November 1915, and left surviving him as his sole and only heirs-at-law his wife, petitioner herein, Dicy Stake, formerly Tiger, formerly Carruth, being enrolled as Dicy Carruth, opposite roll No. 1249 on the final approved rolls of the Creek Nation; that said Alberd Tiger also left surviving him a son Amos Tiger who is not enrolled, and is of the age of about 13 years, a son of Sunday Tiger, who was not enrolled and who died intestate, unmarried and without issue, January 12, 1918, being of about the age of 12 years; that your petitioner, Dicy Stake, formerly Tiger, Formerly Carruth, Creek Roll No. 1249, is now
