

ARTICLE 5.
MISCELLANEOUS.

COMPARED

SECTION 1; Standing and special committees shall have such powers and perform such duties as the board of trustees shall prescribe.

SECTION 2; No shareholder owning or representing less than one hundred shares of the capital of the association, unless said shareholder is one of the trustees of the association, shall be allowed to examine the books and accounts of this association, except by resolution of the board of trustees.

SECTION 3; Any shareholder, officer or trustee may at any time waive any notice required to be given under these by-laws.

SECTION 4; Whenever under the provisions of these by-laws, notice is required to be given to any trustee, officer or shareholder, it shall not be construed to be limited to personal notice, but such notice may be given in writing, by depositing the same in the post office or letter box, postpaid, addressed to such trustee, officer or shareholder at his or her last address as the same appears on the books of said association.

SECTION 5; The board of trustees may annually, semi-annually or quarterly declare a dividend of such part of the net earnings of the association as it may deem prudent to divide, carrying all or any part of the residue to surplus fund, or to the use of the improvements as it shall deem best.

SECTION 6; these by-laws may be altered, modified, amended or added to by a majority vote of the trustees present at any meeting of the board of trustees.

SECTION 7; The trustees shall pay to the officers of the association a legitimate salary and expenses for traveling or indebtedness otherwise incurred by the promotion of the business at any regular or called meeting.

The present board of trustees hereby approves and accepts the above by-laws.
