RATIFICATION OF LEASE

COMPARED

WHEREAS, heretofore and on the 7th day of August, A. D., 1908, Jennie Bruner, enrolled on the final and approved Rolls of the Creek Tribe of Indians, as a full blood member of said tribe, opposite Roll No. 5814, did make, execute and deliver a certain oil and gas mining lease on the form prescribed by the rules and regulations of the Secretary of the Interior of the United States, wherein W. A. Springer and E. R. Minshall, of Tulsa, Oklahoma, were named as lessees and which said lease covered the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 6, Township 19 North, Range 12 East, and which said lease was, by the Secretary of the Interior of the United States, approved on the 14th day of September, A. D., 1908, and recorded in the office of the County Clerk of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, on the 1st day of February, A. D., 1919 and recorded in Book 255, page 149; and

WHEREAS, by sundry assignments, the title to the oil and gas mining lease above mentioned and described insofar as it covers the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 6, is now vested in the Shaffer Oil and Refining Company, J. E. Fitz Patrick, P. K. French and W. M. Thompson, so far as it grants the right to mine for oil and gas found below the top of the Mississippi line, under the terms and provisions of a certain contract between J. E. Fitz Patrick of the first part, and the Mary Oil and Gas Company, and the Sand Springs Home, corporations, of the second part, and which said contract is now of record in the office of the County Clerk of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, and

WHEREAS, the said oil and gas mining lease is in force and effect by reason of operations and developments had on said lands under the terms thereof, and both oil and gas have been produced from said lands and are now being produced therefrom; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the execution of said oil and gas mining lease, the said Jennie Bruner, died intestate in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, on or about the 5th day of February, 1909; and

WHEREAS, Ben Haikey, Jr. did on the 6th day of February, A. D., 1924, then claiming to be one of the heirs of Jennie Bruner, deceased, make, execute and deliver a certain deed of said date, conveying all of his right, title, claim, interest and demand of, in and to the lands above described to W. L. Ransom, which said deed was by the County Court of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, approved on said date, by reason of which the said W. L. Ransom is now the owner of any right, title and interest inherited by the said Ben Haikey, Jr., in and to the allotment of the said Jennie Bruner; and

WHEREAS, the said W. L. Ransom has adopted the terms and provisions of the said oil and gas lease above referred to insofar only as it affects and covers the right of the said Shaffer Oil and Refining Company, J. E. Fitz Patrick, P. K. French and W. M. Thompson, to operate on and produce oil and gas from the level below the top of the Mississippi line in, on and under the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 6, Township 19 North, Range 12 East.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the premises as well as the sum of Ten and --- more dollars in hand paid to the said W. L. Ransom, by the Shaffer Oil and Refining Company, J. E. Fitz Patrick, P. K. French, and W. M. Thompson, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said W. L. Ransom has and hereby does adopt, so far as it covers
