

A strip, belt or piece of land One Hundred (100) feet in width, comprising all that portion of the South East quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Number Six (6) in Township number Nineteen (19) North of Range number Thirteen (13) East, Extending from the South line of said SE $\frac{1}{4}$ at Station No. 2361-01⁶ Northwesterly a distance of 2851-01⁶ feet to the west line of said tract of land at Station No. 2389-52⁹ the same being fifty feet on each side of the center line of said Company's railroad the same is now located and surveyed over and across the above described subdivision of land, the map of which said survey of said railroad has heretofore been approved by the Secretary of the Interior, also two other strips of land, each being 25 feet in width, one lying Northeasterly of and the other lying South westerly of both adjacent to and parallel with the above described right of way, both of said strips extending from the South line of said tract of land, for a distance of 1180 feet to Station No. 2373

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the premises hereby conveyed, with all the rights, privileges and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining unto the said MISSOURI, KANSAS AND OKLAHOMA RAILROAD COMPANY, party of the second part, its successors and assigns, in fee simple forever, free, clear and discharged of and from all former grants, charges, taxes, judgments, mortgages and other liens and incumbrances of whatsoever nature; and I, the said Alvin T. Hodge as such Father and Natural guardian of said May Hodge, a minor and incompetent because of tender years, and for and on behalf of said May Hodge and her heirs, executors and administrators, hereby covenant to warrant and defend the title to the premises hereby conveyed against the claims of any persons or party.

This deed is made by the party of the first part over the allotment of the said Mah Hodge, the Certificate Number which is Number 11812, under authority of the provisions of the Act of Congress of March 2, 1899, and is intended to convey all such right as said party of the first part may lawfully convey to said party of the second part under the provisions of said Act of Congress and the laws of the United States, and the undersigned hereby consents that the said Railroad Company, or the persons acting for or under it in the construction of its said line of railroad, may at once enter upon and take possession of the said above described premises.
