ASSIGNMENT OF OIL AND GAS LEASES

The undersigned, J. O. Whitman and Mattie L. Whitman, his wife and the undersigned, Ruby May Hancock entered into a written contract under which the said Ruby May Hancock agreed to drill an oil and gas well upon the South one-half of the Southeast quarter of Section twenty-three (23, Township Nineteen (19) North, Range thirteen (13) East in Tulsa County, Oklahoma and the said J. O. Whitman agreed to pay for certain labor and perform other conditions more particularly set out in said contract.

And whereas, the said Ruby May Hancock has moved her drilling machinery upon said real estate and has commenced the drilling of a well thereon and said Whitman has incurred some liabilities to labors under said contract and it has been and is hereby agreed that the said Ruby May Hancock shall advance to and pay the drillers and tool dressers who have already worked on said well and who will continue to work on said well the amounts already earned and which will be earned by said drillers and tool dressers until said well is drilled to a depth of eight-hundred (800) feet, unless oil or gas is found at a lesser depth.

It is further agreed that the said Ruby May Hancock shall keep and accurate account of all amounts paid and advanced and that such payments and advancements are for and in behalf of the said J. O. Whitman and all amounts so advanced and made shall be repaid by the said Whitman to the said Ruby May Hancock in accordance with said written contract heretofore entered into and referred to above.
