Comes now Jesse Tiger and respectfully states to the court that one, Sah-co-po-chuny Tiger is a citizen of the Creek Nation, duly and enrolled as such opposite Creek Roll Number 9214, and died intestate on or about the 10th day of April 1899, within and a resident of what is now known as Okmulgee County, State of Oklahoma, and that this is the court having jurisdiction of the settlement of her estate.

That after the death of said citizen, there was duly allotted and deeded to her heirs the following described lands to-wit:

The South half of the Northwest quarter (S $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$) and the South Forty Acres of Lot Three (S 40 A of L 3), and the South Forty Acres of Lot Four (S 40 A of L 4), All in Section Five (5), Township Sixteen (16) North, Range Thirteen (13) East, containing 160 acres more or less,

That your petitioner is a son and one of the heirs of the said Sah-co-po-chuny Tiger and as such heir did, for and in consideration of the sum of \$1000.00, on the 15th day of September, 1920, make, execute and deliver to one, S. W. Tiger, a petitioners one-sixth interest in and to the lands above described and that said deed is of record in the office of the County Clerk, Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, and recorded in Book 300, at page 322.

That your petitioner is duly enrolled as a full blood citizen of the creek nation, opposite Creek Roll Number 1926 and verily believes that it is to his best interest that
