

of a servants' house to be used only by servants of the owner or lessee of the lot or lots here by conveyed, shall not be considered as a breach of the conditions hereof. Any violation of the foregoing condition and restriction by the party of the second part, his heirs or assigns, shall work a forfeiture to all title in and to said lots, and that the above conditions and restrictions shall extend to and are hereby made obligatory upon party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever, together with all and singular, the hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging, and the title shall thereupon reinvest in parties of the first part, their heirs or representatives; provided, however, that the forfeiture herein provided shall never be invoked and never become operative against any corporation, partnership or individual who has become a mortgagee in good faith, prior to the breach of the foregoing covenants, to the extent of said mortgagee's interest in and to the land or premises herein conveyed.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all and singular, the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever .

And the said Margaret E. Reynolds, E. P. Harwell and Mary W. Harwell, for their heirs, executors, or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said part--- of the second party, that at the delivery of these presents they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of and in all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unincumbered of and from all former and other grants, titles, charges, estates, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances of whatsoever nature or kind---- Except taxes not now delinquent,, and that they will WARRANT AND FOREVER DEFEND THE SAME unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, against said parties of the first part, their heirs, administrators, assigns, and all and every person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same. All taxes and special assessments, not now delinquent, shall be paid by the party of the second part.
