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KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS;

THAT WHEREAS at the June term, 1923, of the District Court, within and for Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, and on the 23rd day of October, 1923, in actions then pending in said Court wherein Close Bros. & Company, a corporation, was plaintiff and C.O. Frye, et al, were defendants, said cause of action being 21797; and an action wherein the Exchange Trust Company, a corporation, was plaintiff and C.O. Frye, Vandella Frye, Howard Frye, Gertie Frye, and G.R. McCullough, et al, were defendants, being case No. 18463; and in a further case wherein the Tulsa Rig, Reel and Manufacturing Company, a Corporation, was plaintiff and C.O. Frye was defendant, being case No. 16492; and another cause of action wherein F.P. McCormick was plaintiff and Mason Manufacturing Company, et al, were defendants, being case No. 24401, by the considerations of the court the following plaintiffs, intervenors and cross-petitioners obtained judgments as follows, to-wit;

Close Bros. & Company, a corporation, against C.O. Frye and Howard Frye, for the sum of \$620.17, with 7% interest from October 23, 1923, and \$75.00 attorneys' fees, and its costs in said cause expended;

F.P. McCormick against C.O. Frye and E.H. Frye, in the sum of \$70.06, with 7% interest from February 1, 1922, and \$25.00 attorneys' fees, and his cost in said cause expended;

Exchange Trust Company, a corporation, against C.O. Frye, Vandella Frye, Howard Frye, and Gertie Frye, in the sum of \$6590.34, with 10% interest from November 1, 1923, and \$200.00 attorneys' fees and its cost in said cause expended;

First National Bank of Tulsa, Oklahoma, against C.O. Frye, and Howard Frye, in the sum of \$12,925.00, with interest at the rate of 8% from November 1, 1923, and \$1300.00 attorneys' fees and its costs in said cause expended;

L.E. Kimberlin against C.O. Frye and Howard Frye in the sum of \$255.89, with interest at 6% from July 22, 1921, and \$75.00 as attorneys' fees and his cost in said cause expended;

L.E. Huddleson against C.O. Frye in the sum of \$483.50, with interest at 6% from the 15th day of December, 1921, and \$50.00 as attorney's fees and his cost in said cause expended;

Commercial Electric Company against C.O. Frye in the sum of \$237.70, with interest at 6% per cent per annum from the 12th day of August, 1921, and \$75.00 as attorneys' fees and its cost in said cause expended;

Tulsa Rig, Reel and Manufacturing Company against C. O. Frye, in the sum of \$602.37, with interest at 6% per annum from August 29, 1921, and \$75.00 as Attorneys' fees and its cost in said cause expended; and J.W. Britt against C.O.
