THIS INDENTURE, Made this 28th day of October A. D. 1908, between
 Frank L. Eggell and Nannie L. Eggell, his wife,
 of Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part and Thomas Wayne Eggell
 William Caldwell Eggell and Lewis Edward Eggell, of the second part.

WITNESSETH, That said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of

One dollar and other considerations and 10 DOLLARS,
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents, Grant, Bargain, Sell and Convey unto said parties of the second part, their

heirs and assigns, all of the following described Real Estate, Situated in the County of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

Part of Lots 3 and 4 in Block 12 original town now City of Tulsa particular
 described as follows: Commencing at a point on the Easterly lot line of said
 Lot 3, 50 feet in a northwesterly direction from the south east corner of said
 Lot 3, running thence in a northwesterly direction and along the easterly lot
 line of said Lot 3, a distance of 50 feet thence in a southwesterly direction
 parallel to the northerly lot line of said Lots 3 and 4 across said Lot 3 as a
 part of said lot 4, a distance of 140 feet, thence in a southwesterly direction and
 parallel to the line dividing said lots 3 and 4 a distance of 50 feet thence
 in a southwesterly direction parallel to the southerly lot lines of
 said Lots 3 and 4 across a portion of said lot 4 and across said lot 3 to
 the place of beginning; same being a plot or parcel of land 50x140 feet having a frontage
 of 50 feet on the east and a depth of 140 feet, being subject however to the following conditions:
 First, The intention is hereby that the said grantee take the premises above
 described as joint tenancy so that the doctrine of survivorship shall apply
 Second, In case of the death of all of the aforesaid grantees and the grantor (Frank
 L. Eggell) shall survive them, then in that event of the title to the premises
 above described, shall revert to and become the property of the said grantor absolutely,
 otherwise the provision to be null and void.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME, Together with all and singular the Tenements, Hereditaments and Appurtenances thereunto belonging or in
 anywise appertaining forever.

And said Frank L. Eggell and Nannie L. Eggell for themselves and their
 heirs, executors, or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said parties of the second part that at the delivery of these
 presents, they are lawfully seized in their own right of and absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of and to all
 and singular, the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from
 all former and other Grants, Titles, Charges, Estates, Judgments, Taxes, Assessments, Encumbrances, of what nature or kind soever;

and that they will warrant and forever defend the same unto said parties of the second part, their heirs and assigns, against said parties
 of the first part, their heirs, and all and every person or persons, whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
