GRANT OF RIGHT OF WAY.

For and in consideration of twenty five dollars (\$25.00) to the undersigned in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, I or we do hereby grant to William O. Bohnefeld of Tulsa, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, his successors or assigns, the right of way to passage at all times on foot, by wagon or automobile, on, over or through the following described lands, to-wit:

A strip of land twenty feet in width and running along the entire west line from the north west corner to the south west corner of the northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of section nine (9) township twenty (20) north of range fourteen (14) east of the Indian Base and Meridian, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, with ingress and egress to and from the same. The said grantors their heirs and assigns, to fully use and enjoy the said premises the same as the said grantee, his heirs or assigns for the purposes herein specified. It is further agreed that the expense of maintaining and keeping said road or right of way in a good and passable condition shall be borne equally by the grantors and the grantee or their heirs or assigns and no damage shall ever be claimed by the grantors, their heirs or assigns from the grantee his heirs or assigns because of this grant or from the resultant use of the same by the grantee, his heirs or assigns for the purposes therein set forth, said grant to run perpetually.
