FINAL DECREE.

Now, on this the 11th day of September, 1924, there coming on for hearing the final report of the administrators, and petition for distribution filed in the above cause on the 19th day of August, 1924, and, it being first shown in the court, that notice of this hearing has been given for more than twenty days prior to this date as provided by law and the orders of this court, said notice being published in the Sand Springs Leader, a newspaper of general circulation published in Sand Springs, Oklahoma, for three consecutive weeks. The first of said notices being published on the 21st day of August, 1924, and the last on the 4th day of September, 1924, proof of said publication being on file in this court, and having been examined, is, by the court approved, and that notice was further given by posting in three public places in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, one of which notices was posted at the City Hall, at Broken Arrow, Oklahoma, where the County Court is held, and all of said notices being posted on the 19th day of August, 1924; and, the court having heard the testimony in said matter finds:

1:

That Susanna Meade died on the 10th day of May, 1916; that she was a bona fide resident of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, at the time of her said death; that she died intestate, seized and possessed with the real property hereinafter described; that she was a widow at the time of her said death, and left surviving her the following children, to-wit: Charley Mead and G.H. Mead, her sons and Susannah Graham, formerly Mead, now Emmons, her daughter, as her sole and only heirs.

The court further finds from the evidence that all claims, including the claim of \$200.00 filed by said G.H. Meade administrator have been fully paid; that the taxes due the State and all costs of this proceeding have been fully paid.

The court further finds that said Susannah Graham, now Emmons is the sole owner of the said property by virtue of deeds from the other heirs of Susannah Meade, deceased, to-wit: Charles Mead, otherwise known as Charley Mead, and G.H. Meade, her sons.
