Thurman, being first duly sworn on oath, says that he is a practicing attorney, residing in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, where ^{he} has continuously resided long before statehood, that for a number of years he has been well acquainted with Christine Adkins and C. C. Adkins, who are the principals in a divorce suit, filed in the District Court, in and for Tulsa County, Oklahoma, on the 16th day of August, 1918, and that your affiant was the attorney for the defendant C. C. Adkins in said suit.

That your affiant knows of his own knowledge that said parties made a satisfactory settlement and adjustment of their property rights before the decree of divorce was granted in said action, and that your affiant knows of his own knowledge that the property known and described as lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, and lots 23, 24, 25, 26, 27 and 28 in block 33, in the town of Skiatook, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, which at that time were in the name of the defendant C. C. Adkins, and remained the property of said C. C. Adkins, under said terms of agreement between Christine Adkins and C. C. Adkins, and that the Christine Adkins waived and relinquished all rights that she had or might have had in said property under and by terms of said agreement regarding the division of their property or property rights.

That thereafter, a hearing was had upon the merits of said Christine Adkins divorce suit and that a decree of divorce was granted to the plaintiff, Mrs. Christine Meeks, and that said parties had made an adjustment between themselves of all property rights, the Journal entry covering the decree in said suit made no mention of such property rights, but was confined wholly to the actual decree of divorce.
