THIS INDENTURE, Made this 21st day of July, 1924, by and between R. D. SANFORD, as Sheriff-of Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, party of the first part, and LaVERN H. DeLONG , of ----- County, State of Michigan, party of the second part, WITNESSETH:

THAT, WHEREAS, by virtue of an order of sale issued out of and under the seal of the Court Clerk of the District Court in and for Tules County, State of Oklahoma, attested on the 19th^Oday of June, 1924, upon a judgment for the sum of \$1536.35, with interest thereon'at the rate of 10% per annum from the 18th day of December, 1923, and \$200.00 attorney's fees, costs in the amount of \$25.55, and accruing costs, and for the foreclosure of the mortgage upon the lands hereinafter described, recovered in said court on the 18th day of December, 1923, in consolidated Civil cases #22909, wherein D.
