KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That for and in consideration of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and other good and valuable considerations this day in hand paid to Martin J. Insull of Chicago, Illinois, hereinafter referred to as First Party, by Tulsa Light and Power Company, an Oklahoma corporation, hereinafter referred to as Second Party, the receipt of which payment is hereby acknowledged, First Party has sold and by these presents does hereby SELL, ASSIGN, TRANSFER and SET OVER unto Second Party, its successors and assigns, all of the electric plant and distribution system, franchise, rights, privileges and properties of every sort, real, personal and mixed, tangible and intangible, by First Party purchased August 11, 1924, by a certain contract of sale and purchase that day executed by Sand Springs Home, Sand Springs Railway Company, and Sand Springs Power, Light and Water Company, all being Oklahoma corporations, and Charles Page of Sand Springs, Oklahoma, on the one hand, and First Party on the other hand, being, among other things, the entire electric plant and distribution system, business and good will, of Sand Springs Home, an Oklahoma corporation, located within certain territory in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, more particularly described as follows:

All of the City of Tulsa and West Tulsa, Oklahoma, and all adjacent subdivisions of each; also all territory south of the Arkansas River between West Tulsa and the point where Sand Springs Power line crosses Arkansas River near Price, Oklahoma; but not including any territory lying west of the City limits of Tulsa and between the Osage boundary and the Arkansas River;

And also the electric light, heat and power franchise created by Ordinance No. 1059 of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, as amended by Ordinance No. 2687 of the said City;

And also the every property, right, privilege, and enjoyment of First Party under the said contract of August 11, 1924, including all net earnings of said properties since August 1, 1924, and all additions to said properties made since said date.
