JOURNAL ENTRY OF JUDGMENT.

Now on this 2nd day of May, 1922, being one of the regular judicial days of the March, 1922, Term of said Court, this cause comes on to be heard in its regular order, and the plaintiff appeared by Aby & Tucker, its attorneys, and the defendants, L. Greenberg, Lena Greenberg and J. Bergman, and each of them, having been three (3) times called in open court to appear and offer their defense to the allegations contained in the petition of the plaintiff herein, came not; but each of them makes default; and the court having ordered that the said defendants, and each of them, are in default; and it appearing to the court that the said defendants, L. Greenberg and J. Bergman, are each in the process of being adjudicated a bankrupt; and that the plaintiff has asked that judgment be entered against the defendant, Lena Greenberg, and it is further appearing to the court that the said defendant, Lena Greenberg, has been personally served with summons more than twenty (20) days prior to this date, as required by law; and the Court having heard all the evidence presented by the plaintiff and being fully advised in the premises, and on consideration thereof finds;

That all the averments of the plaintiff's petition are true, as therein set forth; that the said defendants, and each of them, are indebted to the plaintiff in the sum of Three Hundred Sixty seven and 50/100ths Dollars (\$367.50), together with interest thereon at the rate of six (6) per cent, per annum from the 1st day of April, 1920, until paid, upon an account for goods, wares and merchandise sold and delivered to the defendants by the plaintiff, as evidenced by an itemized statement thereof attached to plaintiff's petition and made a part thereof.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the said plaintiff do have and recover of and from the defendant, Lena Greenberg, the sum of Three Hundred sixty seven and 50/100ths dollars (\$367.50) together with interest thereon at the rate of six (6) per cent, per annum from the 1st day of April, 1920, until this date, amounting to Forty Seven and 36/100ths Dollars (\$47.36) a total sum of Four Hundred Fourteen and 86/100ths Dollars (\$414.86) so as aforesaid found to be due to said plaintiff; and that said judgment bear interest at the rate of six (6) per cent, per annum from this date, until paid; and that
