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## AGREEMENT.

This agreement made this the 28th day of October, 1924, by and between Mattie Hacker, a widow, as party of the first part, and John R. Woodward, as party of the second part, both of Tulsa Oklahoma,

Witnesseth:

That the party of the first part is the owner of lot 5, block 1, in City View addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, and agrees to sell the same, together with the improvements thereon, to the party of the second part upon the following terms;

The entire consideration is \$2000.00 paid and to be paid as follows:

Fifty dollars (\$50.00) cash, paid at the time of the signing of this agreement.

Four hundred and fifty dollars (\$450.00) cash to be paid upon delivery of deed.

The balance to be paid by the party of the second part paying the lumber bill now approximately in the amount of \$436.00 held by the Ing-Bell Lumber Company,

The taxes are to be paid by the party of the first part for the year 1923 and prior years.

The balance, after paying the lumber bill, the party of the second part agrees to pay in monthly installments represented by notes of forty dollars \$40.00 each, bearing 6% interest from date, payable serially on the first of every month beginning with November
