THE MUSKOGEE (CREEK) NATION, Indian Territory.

To all whom these presents ahall come, greeting:

Whereas, by the Act of Congress approved March 1, 1901 (31 stats. 861) agreement ratified by the Creek Nation, May 25, 1901, it was provided that all lands of the Muskogee (Creek) Tribe of Indians, in Indian-Berritory, except as therein provided; should be allotted among the citizens of said tribe by the United States Comission to the Five Civilized Tribes so as to give to each an equal share of the whole in value as nearly as may be, and

Whereas, it was provided by said Act of Oongress that each citizen shall select, or have selected for him, from his allotment, forty acres of land as a homestead for which he shall have a separate ded; and

Whereas, the said Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes, has ceritified that the land hereinafter described has been selected by behalf of Henry Morrison, a citizenof said tribe, as an allotment, exclusive of a fortyfacre homestead, as aforesaid.

Now, therefore, I, the undersigned, the Principal Chief of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act of the Congress of the United States, have granted and conveyed and by these presents do grant, and convey unto the said Henry Morrison, all right, title, and interest of the Muskogee (Creek) Matron, and of all other citizens of said Nation, in and to the following described land, The north east quarter of the southwest quarter, and lots three (3) and four (4) of section thrty one (31) township nineteen(19) morth, and range fourteen (14) east, of the Indian Base and Meridian, in Indian Territory, containing on 'hundred and fourteen and 11/100 (114.11), acres, more or less, as the case may be, according to the United States survey, thereof, subject, however, to all provisions of said Act of Congress relating to appraisement and valuation and to the provisions of the Act of Congress approved June 30, 1902 (Public No. 200).

In witness whereof, I, the Principal Chief of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation, have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of said Nation to be affixed this 20th day of April, A.D. 1903.
