RIGHT OF WAY DEED.

To the Missouri, Kansas & Oklahoma Railroad Company,

Know all men by these presents:

That I, Laura Eubanks, as Mother and natural guardian of Travis Landrum, a minor and incompetent because of tender years, of the Creek Nation, Indian Territory, party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of thirty two dollars & 40/100 (\$32.40) paid to me, the receipt whereof, I do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the Missouri, Kansas and Oklahoma Railroad Company, a corporation, created and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Territory of Oklahoma, party of the second part, its successors and assigns, the following tract or parcel of land, real property and premises situated in the Creek Nation, Western Judicial District of the Indian Territory, that is to say:

A strip, belt or piece of land one hundred (100) feet in width, comprising all that portion of the south east quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of section number twenty three (23) in the township number, nineteen (19) north of range number thirteen (13) east, extending from the south line of said 160 acre tract at station No. 2093 & 96, northwesterly a distance of 1295 feet to the west line of said tract of land at station No. 2106 & 91, the same being fifty (50) feet on each side of the center line of said ^{Company's} Railroad as the same is now located and surveyed over and across the above described subdivision of land, the map of which said survey of said railroad has heretofore been approved by the Secretary of the Interior, also two other strips of land, each being twenty five (25) feet in width, one lying northerly of, and the other lying southerly of, adjacent to and parallel with the above described 100 feet of right of way, both of said strips of land extending from station No. 2105 of said center line of railroad, northwesterly a distance of 191 feet to west line of said land.

To have and to hold the premises hereby conveyed, with all the rights, privileges and
