This Indenture, Made this Seventh day of July A. D. 1906 between Susannah Allay-see Morrison and Thomas Allay her husband his wife of Tulsa Indian Territory, Western District, party of the first part, and A. K. Eysenbach of Tulsa Ind. Ter. party of the second part, witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar, in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, conveyed and quit-claimed, and by these presents does remise, release, sell, convey and quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in the Creek Nation Indian Territory, Western District, and known and described as follows, to-wit:

The North East quarter of Section (21) in Township Eighteen (18), North, range thirteen (13) East, containing one hundred & sixty acres of land more or less

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, interest and claim whatever of the said partys of the first part either in law or equity to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, forever.

And I, Thomas Allay husband

for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said A. K. Eysenbach  
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
