WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

This Indenture, Made this 19th day of December A. D., 1906 between P. L. Price and Minnie Price his wife of Tulsa Indian Territory, Western District, party of the first part, and J. M. Berry of Tulsa, I. T. party of the second part, witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, conveyed and quit-claimed, and by these presents does remise, release, sell, convey and quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in the Town of Tulsa Indian Territory, Western District, and known and described as follows, to-wit:

Eastely Fifty feet of Lot numbered ten and the eastely fifty feet of the southeastly twenty five feet of lot numbered nine, all in Block numbered Eighty nine, in the Town of Tulsa, according to the Government Plat thereof, allowing for the deviation of the line from the true meridian, all lines being parallel with the respective lot and block lines.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, interest and claim whatever of the said party of the first part either in law or equity to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, forever.

And I, Minnie Price wife of the said P. L. Price for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said J. M. Berry all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
