This Indenture, Made this 29th day of January A. D. 1902 between W. D. Dickenson and Stella M. Dickenson his wife of Idaho Indian Territory, Western District, party of the first part, and The Cherokee Company of Idaho Indian Territory, party of the second part, witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred dollars, in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, conveyed and quit-claimed, and by these presents does remise, release, sell, convey and quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, its heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in the Cherokee Nation Indian Territory, Western District, and known and described as follows, to-wit:

West one half of north west quarter of North East quarter and North west quarter of South West quarter of North East quarter of Section Seventeen (17) Township Twenty (20) North Range Thirteen (13) East, containing thirty seven more or less.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, interest and claim whatever of the said part of the first part either in law or equity to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said party of the second part, its heirs and assigns, forever.

And I, Stella M. Dickenson wife of the said W. D. Dickenson for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said The Cherokee Company all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
