

QUIT CLAIM DEED.

WITH PREVIOUS NOTICE OF PAPER

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This Indenture, Made this 10th day of September, A.D. 1907, between C. W. Mitchell and June S. Mitchell,
 and his wife of Wayne, Nebraska, Indian Territory, District, party of the first
 part, and C. W. Jenal of Bloomfield, Nebraska, party of the second part, witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Six thousand five hundred and No/1. dollars,
 to them duly paid, by the party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, and quit-claimed, and by these
 presents doth remise, release, sell, convey and claim unto the said party of the second part, to his heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim
 and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot, piece or parcel of land or improvements situated in the
 Indian Territory, District, and known and described as follows:

An undivided one half (1/2) interest in the following described real estate, Lot Six (6) and the North Nine (9) feet of Lot Seven
 (7), Block Eighty Nine (89). Said North Nine (9) feet of Lot Seven (7) is a piece of ground Nine (9) feet wide at all points
 and is one hundred and forty (140) feet long and adjoining the South side of Lot Six (6), according to the government
 plan of the City of Tulsa.

Also an undivided one half (1/2) interest in a part of Lot One (1) in Block One hundred six (106) particular
 described as follows: Beginning at the northwesterly corner of said Lot One (1), thence ^{North} westerly along the
 south line of South Second Street a distance of fifty (50) feet thence south easterly one hundred (100) feet
 to the south easterly line of said Lot One (1), thence south westerly along the southerly line of said Lot One (1) to the
 westerly line thereof to the alley, thence north westerly along the said westerly line of said Lot One (1) to the
 point of beginning in the City of Tulsa, Indian Territory.

Together with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging.

Above described premises unto the said heirs and assigns, so that neither of the said grantees
 or any person in their name and behalf shall or will hereafter claim, demand, and right or title to the said premises
 or any part thereof, but they and every one of them shall by these presents be excluded and forever barred.
