

COMPLAINT

QUIT CLAIM DEED.

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

This Indenture, Made this 8th day of March A. D. 1907 between Crowe & Carter, by J. Carter, a
member of the firm his wife of Tulsa, Indian Territory, Western District, party of the first
 part, and Thomas E. Shaw of Tulsa, Ind. Ter. party of the second part, wit-
 nesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred fifteen & 89/100 dollars,
 in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, conveyed and quit-claimed, and by these
 presents does remise, release, sell, convey and quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim
 and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in the Creek Nation
 Indian Territory, Western District, and known and described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point 615 feet south of the quarter section corner between sections
Eleven (11) and Twelve (12) Township thirteen (13) North, Range Twelve (12) East, and
extending 650 feet West to the left bank of the Arkansas River, thence south
easterly along bank of said river, a distance of about 129 feet, thence easterly
560 feet to section line of said Township and Range, thence north 75 feet along
section line to a point of beginning, said tract being embraced in Lot 7 of
Section 11, Twp 19 N, R. 12 E.

This deed is made to release a mechanic's Lien of said first parties filed in
the office of the Clerk of U. S. Court at Tulsa, O. T. on Dec. 3, 1906.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, inter-
 est and claim whatever of the said part and of the first part either in law or equity to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said part of the second part,
his heirs and assigns, forever.

And I, wife of the said
 for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
