

QUIT CLAIM DEED.

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

This Indenture, Made this 12th day of March A. D., 1907 between George W. Adams and Minnie E. Adams his wife of Indian Territory District, party of the first part, and The Cherokee Company of Indian Territory party of the second part, witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred & Fifty dollars, in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, conveyed and quit-claimed, and by these presents does remise, release, sell, convey and quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, their heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in the Indian Territory, Western District, and known and described as follows, to-wit: All my interest in and to the West 1/2 of the Section West 1/4, Sec. 14 Tp. 20 North Range 13 East.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, interest and claim whatever of the said party of the first part either in law or equity to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said party of the second part, their heirs and assigns, forever.

And I, Minnie E. Adams wife of the said George W. Adams for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said The Cherokee Company all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
