

QUIT CLAIM DEED.

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

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This Indenture, Made this 31st day of May A. D. 1907 between Joseph S. Price and Adeline Price his wife of Zuba Indian Territory, Western District, party of the first part, and A. F. and Elizabeth Blackburn of Zuba Indian Territory, party of the second part, witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar dollars, in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, conveyed and quit-claimed, and by these presents does remise, release, sell, convey and quitclaim unto the said party of the second part heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in the Creek Nation

Indian Territory, Western District, and known and described as follows, to-wit:
Lots No. 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 in Block No. 200, also lots
No. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 in Block No. 201 and a part of
lot No. 1, in Block No. 204. The part of lot No. 1
in Block No. 204, being the North 60 feet of said
lot, according to the Government Survey of
Zuba, Indian Territory.
This deed being made to correct deed dated
May 10th 1905, in which the Notary Public
failed to state when his commission expired

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, interest and claim whatever of the said party of the first part either in law or equity to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said party of the second part, heirs and assigns, forever.

And I, Adeline Price
wife of the said Joseph S. Price
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said A. F. Blackburn
and Elizabeth Blackburn all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
