WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

This Indenture, Made this 20<sup>th</sup> day of January A. D. 1905 between George Campbell and Bettie Campbell his wife of Tulsa Indian Territory, Western District, party of the first part, and Erastus H. George of Chetopa, Kansas, party of the second part, witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One 00/100 dollars, in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, conveyed and quit-claimed, and by these presents does remise, release, sell, convey and quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, he, his heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in the Young Tulsa Indian Territory, Western District, and known and described as follows, to-wit:

The North (50) feet of Lot Number Two (2) in Block One Hundred and Forty (140) of the Town of Tulsa, according to the Government plat and survey thereof.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, interest and claim whatever of the said parties of the first part either in law or equity to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said party of the second part, he, his heirs and assigns, forever.

And I, Bettie Campbell wife of the said George Campbell for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Erastus H. George all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
